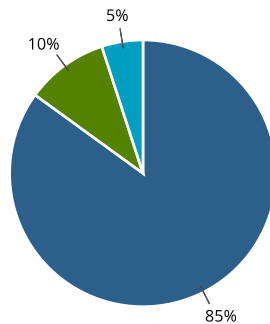

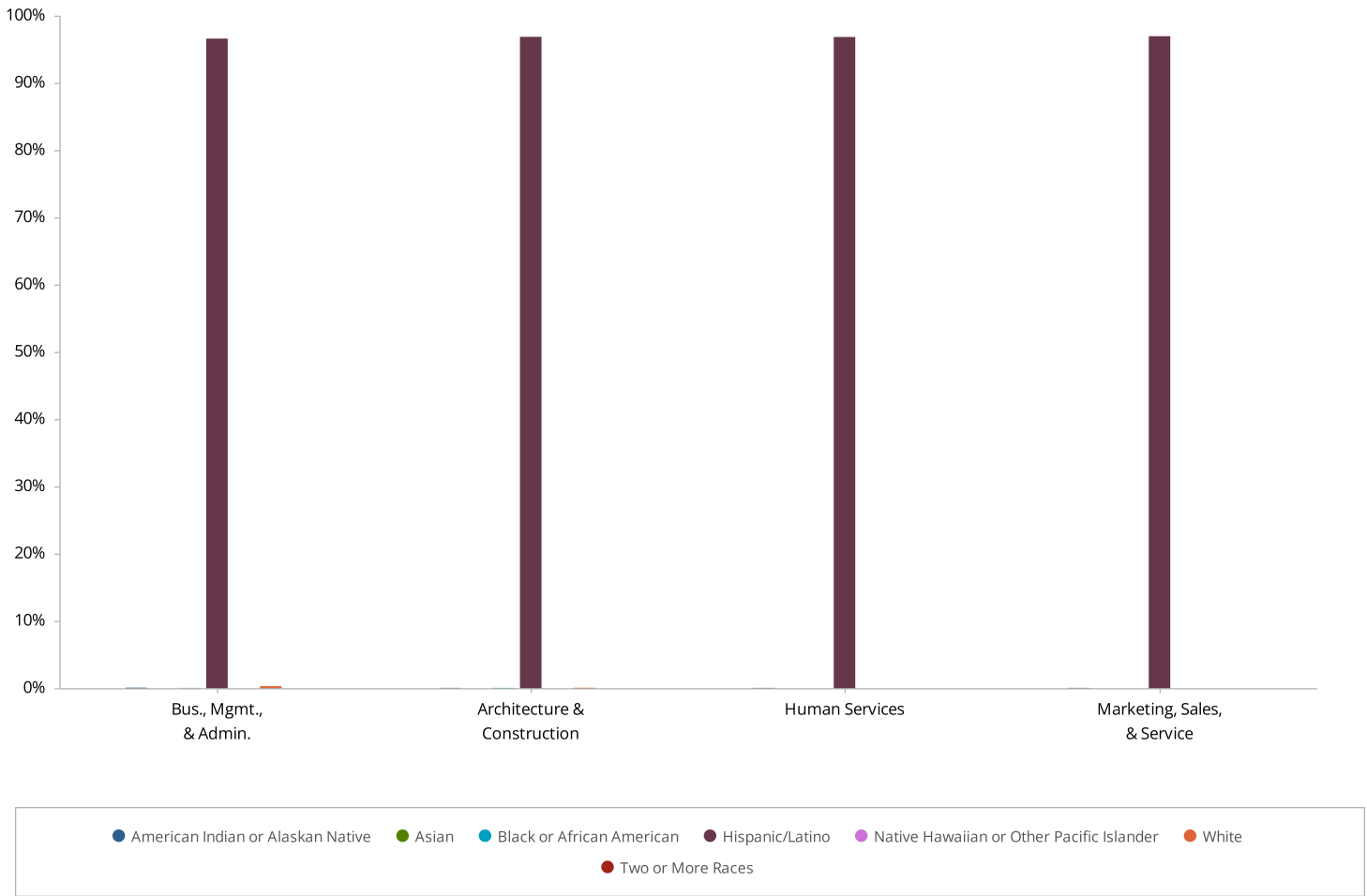
CAREER CLUSTER ENROLLMENT

In 2020-21, there were 27,187 secondary and 981 postsecondary career and technical education (CTE) concentrators in Puerto Rico.

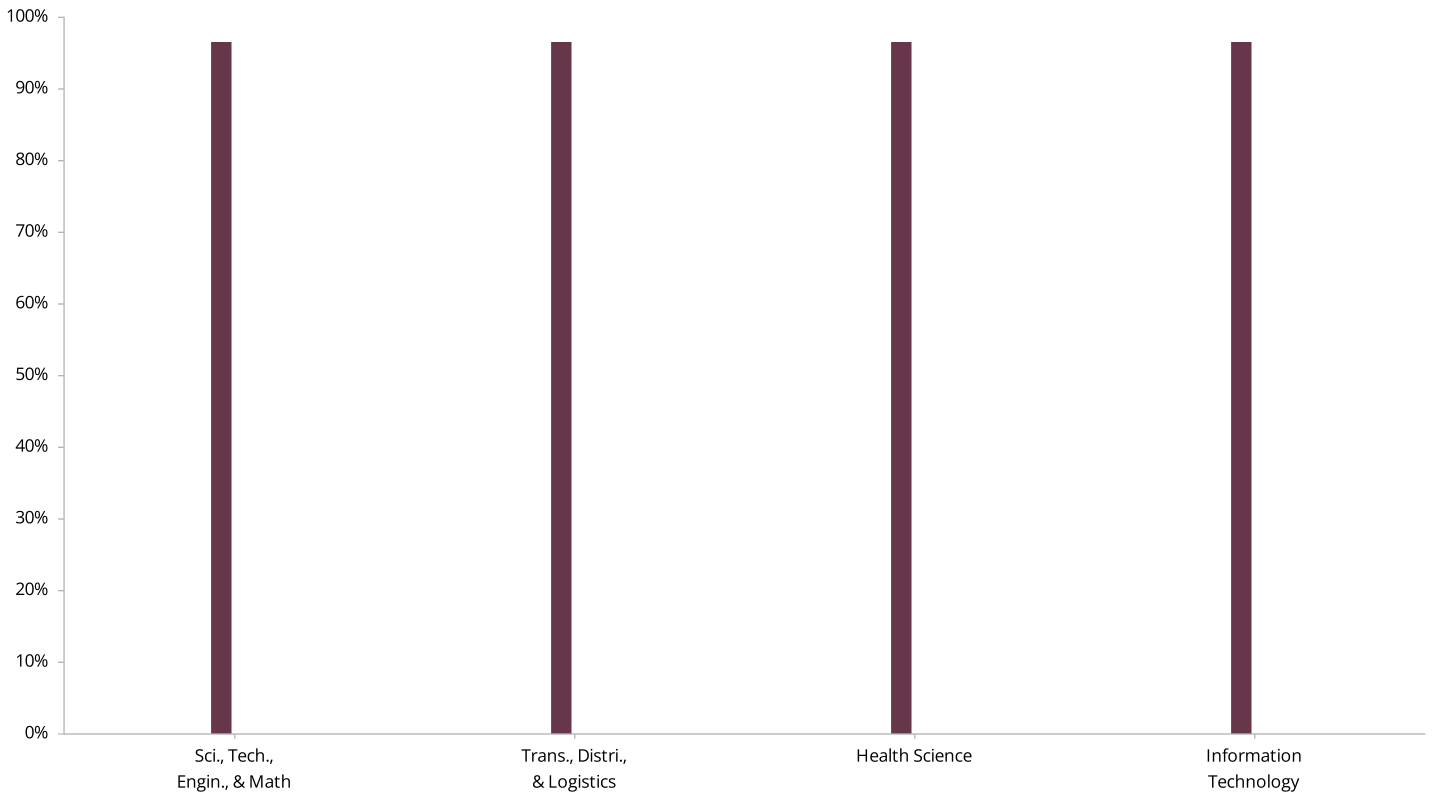
The top four career clusters among secondary CTE concentrators were Business Management & Administration (15.4 percent), Architecture & Construction (11.4 percent), Human Services (9.6 percent), and Marketing, Sales, & Service (9.3 percent).

The top four career clusters among postsecondary CTE concentrators were Science, Technology, Engineering & Math (43.5 percent), Transportation, Distribution & Logistics (16.8 percent), Health Science (11.0 percent), and Information Technology (9.0 percent).

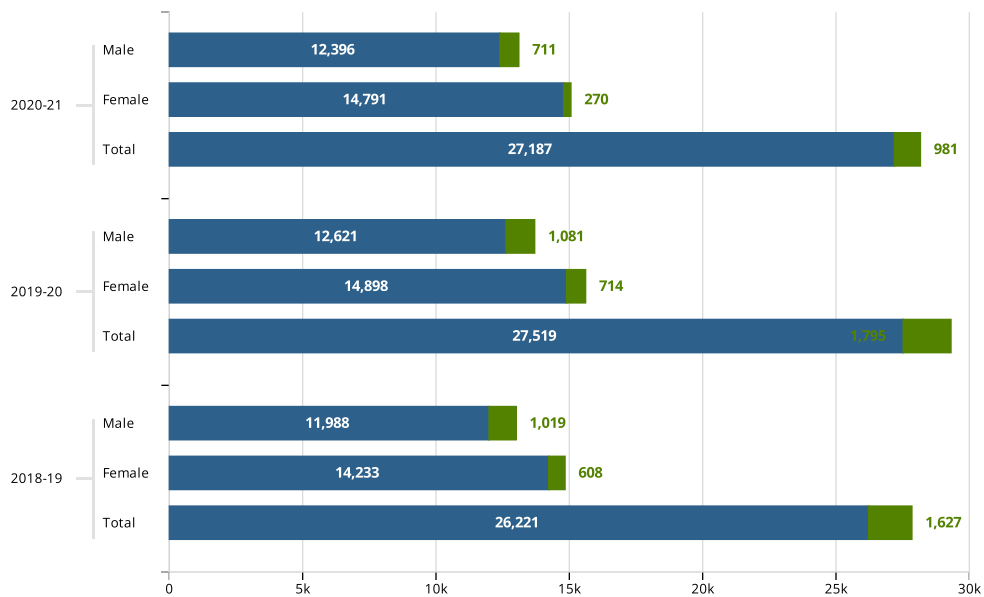

PARTICIPATION IN CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

In 2020-21, there were 28,168 participants in career and technical education (CTE) in Puerto Rico. Of the students reporting as male or female, 45.6 percent of secondary CTE participants were male, and 54.4 percent were female. At the postsecondary level, 72.5 percent of CTE participants were male and 27.5 percent were female.
